

CECINA

The territory of the municipality of Cecina has the particularity of almost exclusively coinciding with the town, but, fortunately, it has the beautiful Pineta dei Tomboli which allows for pleasant walks and numerous accesses to the sea that need not be described here.

However, between the Livorno-Rome railway and the pine forest there is a countryside area, called Paduletto, where it is possible to make a nice totally flat, ring trip. We are located in the extreme northern tip of the Maremma, a place that the Etruscans had reclaimed, through a system of ditches and canals that still exist.

However, the Roman Empire neglected the maintenance of these hydraulic works and, already in the early Middle Ages, the sand and debris had obstructed the mouth of the waterways, forming a system of dunes (called tomboli) and recreating the environment marsh which was maintained until the mid-1700s, when the Marquis Carlo Ginori, on behalf of the Grand Duke of Lorraine, organized the final reclamation of the area.
